

To all deer count helpers, landholders and members of QDM&CG

The 31st annual end of winter deer count took place on Sunday 14th March 2021.

With great relief and huge thanks we managed to undertake the 2021 annual deer count! After a lot of background planning and preparation the Quantock Rangers got the goahead. Timing out of lockdown was on our side – luckily the 2020 count was just in time too! With safe systems in place we negotiated our way through the covid situation. Were the deer aware of the preceding global pandemic? Well they were probably wondering where all the people had gone through the spring and early summer of 2020, the hills were very quiet...but that didn't last and public numbers increased well beyond expectations through the summer, autumn and winter.

Not only did covid influence numbers of people using the hills for recreation it also had a big influence on deer management. Venison prices have been at a very low rate and many stalkers have not been culling and the Quantock Staghounds also had to stop. With these two factors I may have expected a 'spike' in deer numbers for this year's count. While there has been a small increase in 'count' numbers one could have expected this number to have been somewhere between 100 and 200 higher – with the 479no 2020 hind and calf numbers, there would roughly have been 200+ calves born in the summer of 2020.

So what may account for only a small increase – people pressure is quite likely to have pushed some deer to much quieter areas or made their movements much earlier in the morning so they may already have seeked cover before daylight allowed counting to get underway. The increase in high quality agricultural cropping luring the deer to quiet farmland, culling still may have been happening and we know we don't always count all the deer. There was a cold northerly wind blowing in against the northern end of the hills so any deer in the north may have been tucked away.

Encouragingly there has been a small increase in stag numbers for the 3<sup>rd</sup> consecutive year. Again these are stags 'counted' on the morning of the count and it's quite likely that 'Quantock' stag numbers are higher, but they have such a wide range they may be out they counting area.

A big thank you to all who managed to volunteer for the count getting up particularly early. Driving, walking and cycling with the aim to spot as many deer as possible. Nothing quite beats an early spring morning on the hills! And a big thank you to the Rangers for getting the systems in place to get the count underway, it's only foot and mouth that's beaten us in 31 years! Thank you all!


